#### Introduction

Greetings from Chevalier T Thomas Elizabeth College for Women!

We are glad to meet all our students and parents in person after the third wave of COVID 19.

At the outset, I would like to place on record that the CTTE Trust took care of all its stakeholders with utmost sensitivity and care during the three waves of the pandemic from March 2020 to till now. Measures were taken to take care that all our students could complete their courses with ease. Teachers were granted the required leave when they were affected with COVID 19 and students were supported with the required strengthened online teaching facilities and fiscal support.

I would also like to place on record the invaluable service rendered by our teachers to the student community by giving them moral support apart from the regular teaching and posting of learning resources in the GSuite classroom. The class teachers rendered inimitable service and linked each student with the departments. The HoDs in turn worked round the clock to monitor all aspects of education. We faced the challenges headlong and the college took initiatives like refresher classes monitored by the Dean of Academics, so that students do not lag behind in their knowledge acquisition. The academics were meticulously planned, CIAs were conducted regularly and the college did not compromise in its academic standards at all.

#### COVID 19 SOP

This academic year the college opened on July 15, 2021 in an Online mode. As per Government instructions Offline classes began on September 1, 2021 after the second wave of the pandemic. The Government had issued a set of guidelines as SOP for the Educational Institutions and its stakeholders and accordingly, appropriate measures were taken by the College. A COVID Cell was set up and the Physical Director was appointed as the Nodal Officer to monitor COVID appropriate behaviour in the campus. Faculty members, Staff and Students were sensitized on the spread and symptoms of COVID 19, the precautions and measures to be taken contain its spread. Everyone had to install and register in the Aarogya Setu app on their mobile phones. The College coordinated with the Chennai Corporation in conducting frequent COVID screening camps. It also provided counselling by the Inhouse Counsellors. Vaccination was made mandatory for every one inside the campus. Frequent vaccination camps were held by the Chennai Corporation to facilitate vaccination for faculty members, staff & students. It was open for the public too.

The third wave of the pandemic began in the last week of December and the Government instructed the colleges to be closed from January 5, 2022. Hence the college shifted to online mode once again from January 6, 2022. On February 21, 2022 we shifted back to offline mode as the third wave came to a partial end.

Eventually, when students came back to the campus we responded to their needs for physical activities and arranged lots of cultural and sports activities and field visits for them and helped them cope with the stress created by the pandemic. We had our Graduation Day for the 2017-20 batch only on 5th March 2022, after two years.

#### I. Background

Chevalier T. Thomas Elizabeth College for Women is part of the educational institutions managed by the CTTE Trust, a pioneer in the private education sector, which is committed to quality education. T. Thomas Educational Trust was established in 1965 by Chevalier T. Thomas; he founded the prestigious St. Mary's Group of Schools in Perambur that helped to upgrade the social processes and economic activity in the industrialised North Madras. Chevalier T.Thomas Elizabeth College for Women was established in 1985 by the then Correspondent Mrs. Elizabeth Thomas, the wife of late Chevalier T.Thomas with the main purpose of empowering women. We are the first Self-financing College affiliated to the University of Madras and more than 13,000 women students have graduated till now.

The CTTE Trust became a Public Trust in December 2002. Honourable Justice Thiru J. Kanakaraj, Retired Judge, High Court, Madras was appointed by the High Court of Madras as the Chairman of CTTE Trust. Mr. L. Palamalai, IAS retired, became the Managing Trustee and Correspondent, and together they took up the tough and challenging job of developing the academic institutions under the Trust. On February 21, 2022 Honourable Justice Thiru. N. Paul Vasantha Kumar took over as the next Chairman of the C.T.T.E Trust.

#### II. Our Purpose and Objectives

CTTE stands for women empowerment. Our vision is to empower women through Education, Ethics and Economic Development. We aim to reach our goal of women empowerment by providing the right academic atmosphere with the best resources to pursue and gain knowledge; providing opportunities to develop employability skills; inculcating values rooted in our culture and tradition, secularism and humanitarianism. We concentrate on creating a globally competent workforce and our core values are fostering secularism and humanitarianism.

The demographic profile of the region and the demands of contemporary society have shaped our vision and objectives of the college. The country has put gender equity in the forefront as an ideal and we reflect the ideals of the nation. We take all the required steps to ensure our students emerge as self confident young women who have the freedom to choose a career of their choice. We balance knowledge, ability and skills and have programmes to focus on each of these elements of learning.

#### **III. Best Academic Practices of CTTE**

1. Technology Enabled Teaching and Learning [TETL] aided us to seamlessly shift to the virtual platform during the pandemic. We offer certificate courses like Python, TALLY, Basic and Advanced Excel, NMEICT courses, English for Workplace etc. Weekly once, the classes are conducted online and in these Gsuite classrooms, the best knowledge resources are posted regularly to enable selfpaced learning aiming at creating the autonomous learner. Teachers teach the curriculum thoroughly and expose the students to current affairs and contemporary updates in their courses.

#### 2. Partnership in Language and Learning (PILL)

PILL is collaborative learning by pairing advanced and slow learners. This initiative has brought forth young academic leaders who become experts in subjects they teach; it has enabled a democratic learning environment in the campus. Also it is slowly empowering young women. 3. **Competitive Exams Training:** We train our students for taking up TNPSC/UPSC exams, Bank Exams, or any other government examinations. Each department conducts certificate courses to sharpen the skills of students.

- Our students have secured a centum result for almost all the courses in the university online exams.
- Vedavalli.R B.Sc. Chemistry has got the First Rank in the University. The university has informed us only this and we are waiting for the communication regarding the other ranks.

The College balances the teaching/learning process with research and entrepreneurship. Every department aims at bringing students into research and development. Till now, 59 research papers have been presented by UG/PG/M.Phil students at various conferences.





# **Milir- Report**

#### **Milir- Report**

**Milir** is a company that has been created under CFSD's initiative. It is an Organic product (bathing soaps, manure, fertilizer, pesticide, recycled paper, organic dyeing) developed by the students and Mrs. Amalthi of CFSD, and the Department of Chemistry, Chevalier T. Thomas Elizabeth College for Women.

The objective of starting a company with CTTE students are:

- To explore the practical scientific knowledge of students for solving societal needs through innovative product design
- To promote the entrepreneurial skills among students and provide start-up opportunities
- To make them earn while they learn
- To promote the incubation activities of the college through student entrepreneurship
- To provide a platform for the college alumni to impart their ideas and expertise for the company's growth
- To strengthen the association of alumni and students
- To manufacture eco-friendly products with zero waste disposal.

The company MILIR has signed an MOU with our college which aids them experiment with their start-up plans and scale it as a business idea and a responsible entrepreneur. The focus on organic products is to manufacture eco-friendly products with zero waste disposal, and environmental protection, to promote good health and well-being of humanity. The designed organic products were manufactured and packed in the pre-incubation centre of the college (Chemistry laboratory). The organic products manufactured by students of the college will be sold under the company name aiding buying and selling among the students and faculty members of the college.

#### Establishment of MILIR

Environment issues have become a global concern over the past few decades. The alarming rise of global warming, increase in sea level, climate change and many other catastrophes are due to anthropogenic degradation of resources. According to Mahatma Gandhi "The earth provides enough to satisfy every man's needs, but not every man's greed". Anthropogenic degradation leads to two major impacts on the environment, depletion of Earth's natural resources and emission of greenhouse gases when energy is generated using natural resources. As the advancement of the human community is achieved by the consumption of energy, we must be conscious of how the energy is generated. Non-renewable energy sources are associated with the emission of greenhouse gases which give rise to global warming. In the cities, environmental consciousness is necessary to minimize the effects of urbanization on the environment. The major issues faced by urban localities are air, water, and noise pollution. So, any organization or institution located in the city must be aware of its role in reducing the impact and switching to greener energy sources.

To promote environmental consciousness, Yuvasree. R and Harini.S, III BSc Chemistry have done a project to measure the carbon emissions of the campus. The project was started to create awareness about the impact of Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions among the students by giving the approximate annual carbon emission of the campus, proposing a few reduction measures to minimize the carbon emission and bring a sense of solicitousness to global warming and climate change among students. The concern for global warming has increased and as a result, many countries have started to think of ways to reduce their carbon footprint. Carbon footprint is the measurement of greenhouse gas emissions caused directly or indirectly by an individual or an organization. India holds the third position in global carbon emission. Knowing the carbon footprint of an institution is essential to have control over activities that impact the environment and provides a baseline for future efforts on campus. So, this project was taken up to estimate the annual carbon emission of Chevalier T Thomas Elizabeth College for Women.

To estimate the carbon footprint, data were collected from various sources like official registers, records, on-site visits, and face-to-face interactions with people. The major sources of carbon emission were LPG consumption, diesel consumption, and purchased electricity. LPG and diesel consumption were categorized as direct emissions and purchased electricity as indirect emissions. Purchased electricity is placed under indirect emission as the country's major source of energy is obtained by burning fossil fuels.

The carbon emission was calculated manually using the emission factor and it was approximated to be 117.475 tons of  $CO_2$  eq per annum. The major contribution towards the total carbon emission is given by purchased electricity (93 tons of  $CO_2$ ), followed by diesel consumption (17 tons of  $CO_2$ ) and LPG Consumption (6 tons of  $CO_2$ ).

To minimize the impact on the environment and create awareness among the students, the following reduction measures can be implemented.

- Shifting to low carbon emission devices such as LED lights.
- Increase the usage of renewable energy.

- Publish an annual report on the carbon emission of the campus.
- Forming a carbon committee to keep track of carbon emissions by monitoring, reporting, and taking action.
- Associating all cultural and official events of the college with low carbon campaigns and other themes related to climate change.
- Setting a chemical effluent treatment plant to minimize the effect on the environment.

To support low carbon emissions, the students engaged in a few smallscale projects such as

- Organic soap making
- Organically dyed fabrics
- Production of soil conditioner
- Paper recycling
- Manufacture organic fertilizer and pesticide

All the above projects promoted plant-based products for a greener campus. The manufacturing of these products involved less machinery and Eco-friendly ingredients.

# Organic soap making

The reason to use handmade soap is the superior ingredients used in soap making. Natural handmade soaps use all-natural ingredients with no harsh chemicals. Typically, handmade soaps are made of pure essential oils, vegetable oils, and butter that are rich in antioxidants, vitamins, and nutrients that are essential to healthy skin. Pure essential oils are also added during the process to give the natural aroma and therapeutic effects. Most importantly, when natural oils are used in commercial soap making, it is not pure essential oil that is used but a material referred to as soap stock. The soap stock is a by-product of the process which purifies raw vegetable oil into edible oil. The contaminants that are not allowed in edible oil end up in the soap stock, and then in commercial soaps. Commercial soaps are made of detergents, sodium Laureth sulfate, sodium lauryl sulfate, and synthetic ingredients that may dehydrate aged skin, and trigger allergic reactions leaving your skin feeling dry and tired. Handmade soaps are crafted from all-natural ingredients that are 100% healthy for use on all skin types and designed to lock in moisture. Natural handmade soaps offer aromatherapy therapeutic benefits. Handmade soaps use pure essential oils to create their scents. The benefits of aromatherapy can help with everything from stress relief to boosting the immune system. For example, if you have insomnia issues. The natural ingredients in most handmade soaps are biodegradable. Meanwhile, the synthetic ingredients in commercial soaps, such as parabens, petrochemicals, phthalates, triclosan, and phosphorus, drain into rivers and lakes and harm fish and other living things. Often manufactured with synthetic ingredients, they're similar to detergents.Recent research reports some of these ingredients to hormone disruption and cancer.

Thus, the students of the II B.sc Chemistry took up a project on organic soap making. They prepared 10 different varieties of organic soap which include (Beetroot, carrot, lime, muthanimetti, neem, potato, rose, and sandal). The extracts of all these organic substances were used in the soap making. All 12 members have been involved in this project work. (Aarthi, Anandavalli, Jaya Priya, Jessy Evangeline, Lalitha Kumari, Malathi, Manimozhi, Nandhini, Ruthra, Subashini, Vinnarasi, and Vishali). The duration of the project was 5 months. The TFM (total fatty matter) and the pH of the prepared soaps were tested in the chemistry laboratory.

#### **Organically dyed fabrics**

The world is concerned about the use of eco-friendly materials, and many research works are being undertaken on the application of natural dyes. In today's world, the use of natural dyes has decreased due to the rise of synthetic dyes. Using synthetic dyes can cause water pollution, land pollution, cause skin diseases, and also health issues. The colors produced by natural dyes and pigments are vibrant. They are biodegradable, non-toxic, and nonallergic. It is easy to extract the natural color from plants, fruits, or flowers. Many natural dyes also have antimicrobial properties, making them safer for kids in particular.

Additionally, natural dyes neither contain harmful chemicals nor carcinogenic components, common to artificial dyes. By using natural dyes, we preserve the environment and lower human dependence on harmful products. The use of natural dyes prevents toxic runoff and residuals from the textile manufacturing and dyeing process from ending up in water streams. Furthermore, the products used in producing natural dyes, particularly plants, produce no waste, unlike the products used in the synthetic dyeing process. This is because plants bypass the entire production process it takes to create synthetic dyes. This is yet another reason why natural dyes are infinitely better for the environment. Natural dyes provide higher UV absorption in the fabrics they are used on.

In view of protecting nature and the advantages over using natural dye Galilone Anandhi. P and Priscilla Roseline K of III B.Sc Chemistry produced natural dyes from the extracts of vegetable waste and fruits. Five major dyes were obtained from nature they are Henna, Turmeric, Onion Skin, Tea, and Kungumam. These dyes were incorporated into the fabrics like shawls and t-shirts and it worked out well. The fabrics used for dying were 100% cotton and a minimum quantity of mordants was used for fixing the dyes in fabrics.

#### Paper recycling

Paper pollution refers to environmental pollution caused by the production of paper. Pulp and paper cause severe adverse effects on the quality of air, water, and land. Discarded paper is a major component of many landfill sites. The amount of paper and paper products used are so enormous that the environmental impact of the pollution caused by it is also very significant. The main components of pulp mill-related pollution are chlorine and chlorine-based materials, sulfur, hydrogen sulphide, and sulfur dioxide. Chlorine and compounds of chlorine are used in the bleaching of wood pulp, especially chemical pulps produced by the kraft process or sulfite process. Plants using elemental chlorine produced significant quantities of dioxins which are persistent organic pollutants that are one of the most toxic human-released pollutants. The chemically treated water used for pulp preparation was released into water bodies, which may affect the aquatic organisms, nearby agricultural land, animals arrive here for drinking water, and even the rural people who were consuming the water without knowing about the pollutant water source.

The BOD level of the released polluted water from the paper industry is generally between 400 - 1353 mg per liter but a nonpolluted water bodies BoD should be between 1-2 paper.99 - 1.997 mg/L). By this, we can conclude that water released from the paper industries was

very much polluted or poorly conditioned water. Air emissions of hydrogen sulphide, methyl mercaptan, dimethyl sulphide, dimethyl disulfide, and other volatile sulfur compounds are the cause of the odor characteristic of pulp mills utilizing the kraft process. Other chemicals that are released into the air and water from most paper mills include carbon monoxide, ammonia, nitrogen oxide, mercury, nitrates, methanol, benzene, volatile organic compounds, and chloroform. Nitrogen dioxide(NO) sulfur dioxide (SO) and carbon dioxide (CO) are emitted during paper manufacturing. All of them cause acid rain and CO is a major greenhouse gas that causes climate change. These toxic gases contribute to air pollution. It may cause a drastic adverse effect on human and environmental health. Fine particulate matter (PM2.5) consists of particles 2.5 microns in diameter or less which can penetrate the respiratory system and have a serious effect on health

Therefore, efforts are needed to ensure that the environment is protected during the production or manufacturing of papers. The recycling of paper is the process by which waste paper is turned into new paper or any other products. It has several important benefits like It saves waste paper from occupying the homes of people and producing methane as it breaks down. Because paper fiber contains carbon, recycling keeps the carbon locked up for longer and out of the atmosphere. A used paper can be recycled up to 6 to 7 times only. This is due to the decreasing fiber content while recycling the paper. The students of the I B.sc Chemistry took up a project on paper recycling. They recycled old newspapers and used sheets of paper and notebooks for new ones. The recycled papers were cut into an even shape with the help of the college press and bound into notepads.

#### **Production of Soil Conditioner**

Plants require good nutrition to grow healthy without any attack of infectious disease and to yield fresh and organic fruit. Soil Conditioner is a mixture of ingredients used to fertilize and improve the soil and it includes the necessary compound for plant growth. In the absence of good nutrition, plants will be unable to complete their normal life cycle. Composting is an aerobic method of decomposing organic solid wastes. It is commonly prepared by decomposing vegetable waste and green waste. It can therefore be used to recycle organic material. It also reduces expenses on commercial chemical manures for recreational gardeners. At the simplest level, composting requires gathering a mixture of Kitchen scraps (vegetable waste). Scrap materials are rich in nitrogen, potassium, calcium, etc, and also another material that is rich in carbon. The decomposition process is aided by shredding the vegetable waste, and brown material and ensuring proper aeration regularly. Compost can be used as an ingredient in the mix used to grow the seedlings. It provides a rich growing medium as absorbent material. This material contains moisture and soluble minerals, which provide support and nutrients.

The compost that is ready to be used as an additive is dark brown or even black with an earthy smell. Compost can be tilled directly into the soil or growing medium to boost the level of organic matter and the overall fertility of the soil. Compost can be used to increase plant immunity to diseases and pests.Composting is an important part of waste management since food and other compostable materials make up about 20% of waste in landfills and these materials take longer to biodegrade in the landfill. Composting offers an environmentally superior alternative to using organic material for landfills because composting reduces methane production, and provides economic and environmental co-benefits.Recycling food and other organic waste into compost provides a range of environmental benefits, including improving soil health, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, recycling nutrients, and mitigating the impact of droughts.

As an environmental concern, Ms. Pooviarasi.M and Ms. Monica.S of III B.Sc Chemistry took up the project on the preparation of soil conditioners. The duration of the project was four months. They were successful in preparing 3kg of soil conditioner. It was then packed into packets of 200g and labelled for sale.

#### Manufacture organic fertilizer and pesticide

Agricultural sustainability relies on organic fertilizer which contributes to improving soil fertility. The use of organic fertilizers has the advantage of being cheap, improving soil structure, texture, and aeration, increasing the soil's water retention abilities and stimulating healthy root development. Organic fertilizer has many sources such as minerals, animal sources, sewage sludge, and plants. Vegetables, animals, and residue materials had a contribution to improving soil organic matter content in the soil. Therefore, using integrated nutrient management is a continuous improvement of soil productivity on a longer-term basis through the appropriate use of organic fertilizers (i.e. animal manure, plants residue, and sewage sludge) and their scientific management for increments of optimum growth, yield, and quality of different crops.

Organic Liquid fertilizers are better at balancing the pH of the soil based on the chemicals they are delivering. Organic liquid fertilizers are natural and non-toxic. Organic liquid Fertilizer is good for the environment. Unlike chemical liquid fertilizers, organic fertilizers are deemed to be entirely safe for the ecosystem they are used in regardless of the quantities retained in the soil. The term pesticide covers a wide range of compounds including insecticides, fungicides, herbicides, rodenticides, molluscicides, nematicides, plant growth regulators, and others. The use of chemical pesticides poses a potential risk to humans and other life forms and unwanted side effects to the environment. The high-risk groups exposed to pesticides include production workers, formulators, sprayers, mixers, loaders, and agricultural farmworkers. By going organic we can reduce pollution and avoid exposure to chemicals in the soil, plants, and ultimately our food and a key benefit to the health of the farmers.

Organic pest control products are typically much safer and more beneficial for the environment overall. Many organic sprays use food or plant-based oils as their active ingredients, giving a natural way to keep pests off without damaging the surrounding environment.

To aid the production of organic vegetables and fruits Ms.A.Akshaya of III B.Sc Chemistry took up the project of preparing organic pesticides and fertilizer. The organic fertilizer prepared is made up of natural ingredients like sour curd, coconut milk, coconut water, and fruits. The organic liquid pesticides prepared are made up of naturally grown leaves like Leaves of vitex negundo, Justicia adhatoda, Lawsonia inermis, Azadirachta indica, and water. The duration of the project was one month. The products were packed into 100ml bottles and labelled for sale.
