

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Chevalier T. Thomas Elizabeth College for Women is one of the premier institutions managed by the Chevalier T. Thomas Educational Trust (CTTE Trust), a pioneering body in the private education sector committed to delivering quality education.

The Trust was founded in 1965 by Chevalier T. Thomas, who also established the renowned St. Mary's Group of Schools in Perambur. His efforts significantly contributed to the social and economic upliftment of the industrialised North Madras region.

The College was established in 1985 by Mrs. Elizabeth Thomas, wife of the late Chevalier T. Thomas, with the primary vision of empowering women through education. It holds the distinction of being the first self-financing college affiliated to the University of Madras, and has since produced over 15,000 women graduates.

The CTTE Trust became a Public Trust in December 2002, with Honourable Justice Thiru J. Kanakaraj (Retd., High Court, Madras) appointed as its Chairman by the High Court of Madras. Mr. L. Palamalai, IAS (Retd.) took over as the Managing Trustee and Correspondent, leading the Trust through significant institutional development.

From February 21, 2022, Honourable Justice Thiru N. Paul Vasantha Kumar served as Chairman of the Trust. On March 6, 2023, Honourable Justice Thiru B. Gokuldas assumed charge as the current Chairman, continuing the Trust's mission of advancing women's education and academic excellence.

INFRASTRUCTURE

- **❖ T. Thomas Auditorium** is air-conditioned with a capacity of around 500 seating, equipped with WiFi and projector.
- ❖ Justice J. Kanagaraj Auditorium is centrally air-conditioned and can seat 700 people, equipped with WiFi and projector.
- ❖ Seminar Hall is air-conditioned with WiFi and projector, and can seat 50 people.

❖ Academy for Developing English & Personality Traits (ADEPT) - CTTE Skill Development Centre

The lab has 40 computers - 30 desktops equipped with Renet software, offering a comprehensive platform to improve English grammar, and 10 laptops. It supports hands-on training in industry-relevant tools such as TALLY for accounting, Python for programming, and Advanced Excel for data analysis. Students also explore emerging technologies through AI tools and platforms like ChatGPT, gaining exposure to real-world applications of artificial intelligence.

***** Transportation Facilities

We operate three buses covering areas such as Madhavaram, Manali, Redhills, Puzhal, Kolathur, Vyasarpadi, Ayanavaram, Otteri, Agaram, and Periyar Nagar. The annual transport fee ranges from ₹11,000 to ₹16,000, depending on the distance.

Facilities for Differently Abled

The college provides facilities to support students with disabilities in their daily activities. Most of the classrooms are accessible via lifts and staircases with hand railings. Ramps are provided along the paths to the main block and other key areas for easier movement. Wheelchairs are also available for students when needed.

DIGITAL INFRASTRUCTURE

❖ G Suite for Education – Learning Management System

CTTE College implemented G Suite for Education in 2018, well ahead of the pandemic, to effectively engage a growing tech-savvy student community. The college holds a lifetime license for G Suite for Education (formerly Google Apps for Education). Access is restricted to CTTE students and faculty, who are provided with domain-specific email IDs upon admission.

Google Classroom forms the core of this system, enabling seamless sharing of content, assignments, and evaluations. Google Meet, integrated within this setup, is used for live tutoring and secure virtual interactions.

❖ E-Resources Centre

The E-Resources Centre supports online learning and skill development with free high-speed internet. It is equipped with printing, scanning, and photocopying facilities for student use. The centre is widely used by undergraduate and postgraduate students, and also by teachers for academic and research work.

The College Library has over 45,000 resources including books, theses, magazines, journals, and audio-visual materials to support learning and research. Turnitin software is available to check for plagiarism and ensure academic honesty.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

CTTE College welcomes applications for its Undergraduate programmes through a transparent, merit-based process. Detailed below are the steps, criteria, and requirements for admission:

1. Application Process

- Online application forms are available on the college website.
- Printed application forms can also be obtained directly from the College Office.
- Completed applications must be submitted to the College Office along with a printout of the Board Exam results (downloaded from the official site) for provisional admission.
- Spot admission may be offered to meritorious candidates, subject to seat availability.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- Students from Tamil Nadu State Board and CBSE are eligible to apply directly.
- Students from other Boards must submit an Eligibility Certificate from the University of Madras at the time of admission.
- All admissions are provisional and subject to verification of mark certificates by the Director of Government Examinations.
 - o If found to be forged, admission will be cancelled and legal action will be initiated.

3. Documents Required at the Time of Interview

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The College follows the **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** as mandated by the **University of Madras**. To be eligible for the award of a degree, a student must:

- Complete the prescribed course of study at a college affiliated to the University for a minimum of three academic years.
- Successfully pass all six semesters of the programme.
- Earn at least 140 credits across Part I, II, III, IV, and V as per the credit distribution framework.
- Fulfil all additional academic and administrative requirements prescribed by the University.

COURSE STRUCTURE (As per University of Madras Regulations)

The College follows the course structure and credit distribution framework prescribed by the University of Madras under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). A minimum of 140 credits must be earned to qualify for the award of the degree.

*Note on Part IV – Language Options

- SEC-1: For students who studied Tamil up to XII Std and have chosen Tamil in Part I.
- **Basic Tamil**: For students who did not study Tamil up to XII Std and have taken another language in Part I.
- Advanced Tamil: For students who studied Tamil up to XII Std but opted for another language in Part I.

EVALUATION SYSTEM

Formative Assessment (Internal – 25 Marks)

• Conducted periodically within the college. Evaluation based on Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA), which includes Tests, Attendance, Seminars, Assignments, etc.

Summative Assessment (External – 75 Marks)

• Conducted by the University of Madras at the end of each semester.

Passing criteria:

- Minimum 40% in external examination
- Minimum 40% overall (internal + external)

Eligibility to Write University Exams

• Students must maintain a minimum of 75% attendance in each semester to be eligible for the end-semester University Examination.
